🏠 Dangers Inside the Home

Electrical & Household Hazards

Exposed electrical cords → risk of electrocution from chewing.

Loose cables or curtain cords → strangulation hazard.

Open fires, heaters, and stoves → burns and serious injury.

Toxic Foods (never leave accessible)

Chocolate, grapes/raisins, onions, garlic, xylitol (sugar-free gum/sweets), alcohol, caffeine.

Bones from cooked meat → splintering and intestinal blockages.

Household Chemicals & Medicines

Cleaning products, antifreeze, insecticides, and detergents → extremely poisonous.

Human medications (painkillers, antidepressants, vitamins) → dangerous even in tiny amounts.

Choking & Swallowing Risks

Small toys, coins, socks, and children's Lego → risk of intestinal blockage.

Plastic bags and cling film → suffocation danger.

🌿 Dangers in the Garden

Toxic Plants (common in South Africa & worldwide)

Oleander, azaleas, lilies, sago palm, daffodils, and cycads.

Mushrooms and fungi that grow after rain.

Outdoor Hazards

Swimming pools, ponds, or uncovered water features → drowning risk.

Sharp garden tools left lying around.

Fertilizers, compost, and pesticides → toxic if ingested.

Escape risks through gaps in fencing or under gates.

Provide Chew Alternatives: Durable puppy-safe toys to redirect chewing behavior.

Fence Off Pool/Pond: Always secure water features with covers or fencing.

Check Fencing: Ensure no gaps or weak spots in the boundary.

Remove Toxic Plants: Replace dangerous plants with safe ones like rosemary, lavender, or sunflowers.

Store Tools & Chemicals: Keep rakes, spades, fertilizers, and pesticides locked away.

Create a Safe Zone: Provide a shaded, escape-proof area where your Rottweiler can play without risk.

✅ Safe Alternatives for Puppies

Chewing: Provide tough rubber toys, frozen Kongs, or safe chew bones.

Exploring: Supervised play in secure areas with enrichment (tunnels, puppy-safe toys).

Water Safety: Use shallow splash pools instead of letting them near deep pools until older.

Training Early: Teach "leave it" and "drop it" to prevent dangerous ingestion.
